Lewis and Clark Expedition: The Journey

In May 1804, the United States Army officers Meriwether Lewis and William Clark set out, with an initial group numbering about 50, on an expedition to explore the newly purchased Louisiana Territory and the Oregon region. Lewis had been handpicked to lead the party by none other than President Thomas Jefferson, and Lewis chose Clark as the party's co-leader. The group, whose aim included gathering scientific information about the region and establishing contact with the Indians along their route, arrived at the Pacific Coast in late 1805. They returned to St. Louis, in what later became Missouri, in September 1806.






