## ANSWERS

- 1. d. Prison.** According to section "Tower of London" on page 10, we know that "The tower has been used as a prison and a place to keep treasure." So, the correct answer is D.
- 2. b. Theater.** According to section "Shakespeare's Globe" on page 16, we know that "The original theater burned down in 1613. The second theater was torn down in 1644. This Globe opened in 1997." So, the correct answer is B.
- 3. d. England, Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland.** According to section "Parliament" on page 22, we know that "Millions of people live in England, Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland. These are the parts that make up the United Kingdom." So, the correct answer is D.
- 4. c. Union Jack.** According to section "Buckingham Palace" on page 27, we know that "Do you see the red, white, and blue flag? It's called a Union Jack." So, the correct answer is C.
- 5.** According to page 32, a Londoner may say *broolly* instead of *umbrella*.
- 6.** According to page 43, a Londoner may say *sarnie* instead of *sandwich*.

## TRUE OR FALSE? ANSWERS

- 1. False.** According to section "Roman London" on page 8, we know that "London is one of the biggest cities in the world." So, the correct answer is False.
- 2. True.** According to section "Monument to the Great Fire" on page 13, we know that "Very few people died in the fire, but 1666 was a dangerous time to live in London. Many people caught bubonic plague." So, the correct answer is True.
- 3. True.** According to section "The London Underground" on page 34, we know that "Londoners have a nickname for the longest subway in the world: the Tube." So, the correct answer is True.
- 4. True.** According to section "Big Ben" on page 20, we know that "Big Ben is the nickname of the tower, the clock, and the bell inside the tower. (The tower's official name is Elizabeth Tower.)" So, the correct answer is True.
- 5. True.** According to section "Buckingham Palace" on page 26, we know that "Today, the royal family lives in Buckingham Palace." So, the correct answer is True.
- 6. True.** According to section "The London Underground" on page 34, we know that "It's just a few steps to Charing Cross Station. This is the city center." So, the correct answer is True.
