ANSWERS

- 1. c. The sunshine.** According to section "Temple of Heaven" on page 27, we know that "Beijingers and tourists come to the Temple of Heaven to enjoy the sunshine." So, the correct answer is C.
- 2. b. Tiananmen.** According to section "Tiananmen Square" on page 10, we know that "We're now at the center of Beijing, in Tiananmen Square. This is the biggest public square in the whole world." So, the correct answer is B.
- 3. d. Hutongs.** According to section "Hutongs" on page 20, we know that "Hutongs are narrow streets between buildings." So, the correct answer is D.
- 4. a. Chopsticks.** According to section "Temple of Heaven" on page 26, we know that "People in China use chopsticks in place of forks, knives, and spoons." So, the correct answer is A.
