ANSWERS

- 1. c. A silken egg sac. According to the section "You're on Your Own" on page 8, we know that "Most spider species protect their eggs by wrapping them in a silken egg sac." So, the correct answer is C.
- **2. a. Marsupials.** According to the section "Hitching a Ride" on page 20, we know that "Some kinds of mammals carry their young in a pouch. They are called marsupials." So, the correct answer is A.
- **3. b. A few days after she mates with** a male. According to the section "Feeding Baby" on page 24, we know that "Scorpion eggs hatch inside the female a few days after she mates with a male." So, the correct answer is B.

- **4. d. Seahorses.** According to the section "Hitching a Ride" on page 22, we know that "Male seahorses are the only male animals that give birth to live young." So, the correct answer is D.
