- **3. b. Germany.** According to section "Wings of World War II" on page 25, we know that "On the other side, known as the Axis Powers, the three chief nations were Germany, Italy, and Japan." So, the correct answer is B.

Winston Churchill.** According to section "Wings of World War II" on page 33, we know that "Winston Churchill, the British prime minister, gave a speech in which he summed up their courageous deeds in these words, 'Never ... was so much owed by so many to so few'." So, the correct answer is C.

TRUE OR FALSE? ANSWERS
