- 1. a. Warm areas. According to section "What Are Amphibians?" on page 4, we know that "Most amphibians live in warm, wet areas." So, the correct answer is A.
- 2. b. South American golden dart frog.
 According to section "How Do Amphibians
 Hunt and Escape?" on page 28, we know that
 "The South American golden dart frog is more
 poisonous than the deadliest snake." So, the
 correct answer is B.
- **3. d. Caecilian.** According to section "What Amphibians Live Underground?" on page 35, we know that "The grooves along a caecilian's body are an adaptation that helps it move through the soil." So, the correct answer is D.

- **4. b. Asia.** According to section "Why Are Some Amphibians Endangered?" on page 28, we know that "In Asia, the meat of the Chinese giant salamander is considered a special treat." So, the correct answer is B.
