ANSWERS

- **1. b. About 4 months old.** According to section "Extra-Special Dogs" on page 7, we know that "When it is about 4 months old, the puppy starts attending obedience school." So, the correct answer is B.
- 2. a. German shepherds. According to section "Crime Fighters" on page 13, we know that "Most police dogs are German shepherds. These dogs are smart, strong, brave, and big enough to either gently help a small child or terrify a desperate criminal." So, the correct answer is A.
- **3. d. Voice commands.** According to section "Acrobats and Actors" on page 18, we know that "Acting in front of a camera is especially difficult. Because of the microphones, the trainer cannot give the dog voice commands." So, the correct answer is D.

- 4. a. Purebred aighthounds. According to section "Trials and Tests for Working Dogs" on page 29, we know that "Another kind of test is called coursing, or sight hunting. Only purebred sighthounds can participate in this event." So, the correct answer is A.
- **5.** According to page 20, Rin-Tin-Tin was a German shepherd movie star.
- **6.** According to page 33, a bench show is a show at which dogs competing for prizes are "benched"—that is, kept on a bench before and after judging.

TRUE OR FALSE? ANSWERS

- 1. False. According to section "Extra-Special Dogs" on page 6, we know that "Guide dogs usually are purebreds. The first kind of dog trained for this important work was the German shepherd." So, the correct answer is False.
- **2. False.** According to section "Extra-Special Dogs" on page 9, we know that "Training for a signal dog takes about three to six months." So, the correct answer is False.
- **3. True.** According to section "On the Trail" on page 15, we know that "When a bloodhound finds someone, it never attacks. It wags its tail! It is happy to find the person it was looking for. To the dog, there is no difference between a lost child and a criminal." So, the correct answer is True.
