ANSWERS

- 1. c. Dry, hot environments. According to section "Desert" on page 8, we know that "Deserts have dry, hot environments with extremely high temperatures and little rainfall." So, the correct answer is C.
- **2. a. Songbird.** According to section "Forest" on page 17, we know that "Color-changing autumn leaves beautifully mask the brown, green, and orange markings of the small silvereye songbird." So, the correct answer is A.
- **3. b. Earth's poles.** According to section "Polar" on page 22, we know that "Polar regions are located at each of Earth's poles, or ends, and cover about one-tenth of Earth's surface." So, the correct answer is B.

- **4. a. One-fourth of the land on Earth.**According to section "Grassland" on page 28, we know that "Grasslands cover about one-fourth of the land on Earth and are found on six continents." So, the correct answer is A.
- **5.** According to page 36, a "pygmy seahorse's yellow-dotted body helps it to safely blend into the similarly patterned sea fan coral."
- **6.** According to page 12, an Arabian camel has a single hump.

TRUE OR FALSE? ANSWERS

- **1. True.** According to section "Forest" on page 27, we know that "Amazingly, chameleons can change their scales to match thousands of backdrops." So, the correct answer is True.
- **2. True.** According to section "Polar" on page 25, we know that "The Arctic fox hides among chunks of ice on the surface of the Hudson Bay." So, the correct answer is True.
- **3. False.** According to section "Polar" on page 26, we know that "Birds called ptarmigans have crisp white feathers in the winter to blend in with snow." So, the correct answer is False.
