ANSWERS

- 1. d. All the above. According to page 40, we know that Kaia says the haka "shows the tribe's pride and strength. And our unity." So, the correct answer is D.
- **2. a. Greenstone.** According to page 50, we know that *hei-tiki* is made of "greenstone." So, the correct answer is A.
- **3. b. Moko kauae.** According to page 58, we know that, "The term for a tattoo on a woman's chin is *moko kauae.*" So, the correct answer is B.
- **4. c. A.D. 1200.** According to page 100, we know that, "... historians think the Māori first settled in New Zealand around A.D. 1200." So, the correct answer is C.

- 5. According to page 31, we know that, "Structures made out of what looked like really strong straw dotted an open area. Long, thick planks of wood formed a fence around the community. The planks were so straight and powerful—it was as if they were standing at attention."
- **6.** According to page 105, we know that, "When someone gives someone else a tattoo, they prick the skin with needles. Then they inject small amounts of ink to the underparts of the skin. Ink sinks deep, deep into the skin."
