ANSWERS

- **1. d. Tiny drops of water.** According to section "Clouds and rain" on page 5, we know that "Clouds are made up of tiny drops of water." So, the correct answer is D.
- **2. a. Snowdrift.** According to section "Snow and Ice" on page 10, we know that "The wind blows the snow into a big pile called a snowdrift." So, the correct answer is A.
- **3. c. Somewhere warmer.** According to section "Cool Autumn" on page 21, we know that "These birds are about to fly to a warmer place far away." So, the correct answer is C.
- **4. a. Pine tree.** According to section "Cold Winter" on page 22, we know that "Even in freezing winter pine trees keep their leaves, called needles." So, the correct answer is A.
- **5.** According to page 26, the bands of color in a rainbow always appear in this order: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo, and violet.
- 6. According to page 27, most of the world's tornadoes happen in "Tornado Alley," which stretches across the Midwestern and Southern United States.

TRUE OR FALSE? ANSWERS

- 1. True. According to section "Wind" on page 7, we know that "A fierce wind called a tornado whirls around like a spinning top." So, the correct answer is True.
- **2. True.** According to section "It's a Storm!" on page 8, we know that when "The wind starts to howl, you know a storm is on the way." So, the correct answer is True.
