## **ANSWERS**

- 1. A. Shells. According to section "Brazilian Three-banded Armadillo" on page 5, we know that "Armadillos are mammals protected by a shell made up of small, bony pieces." So, the correct answer is A.
- **2. d. Skin.** According to section "Poison Dart Frog" on page 11, we know that "Poison dart frogs are small, colorful frogs with poisonous skin!" So, the correct answer is C.
- **3. c. Small.** According to section "Blue-ringed Octopus" on page 16, we know that "They are small, but blue-ringed octopuses are among the deadliest animals in the ocean." So, the correct answer is C.

- **4. b. Barbs.** According to section "Porcupine" on page 20, we know that "Some quills have sharp ends that point backwards. They are called barbs." So, the correct answer is B.
- **5.** According to page 19, the spines and fins of a lionfish resemble a lion's mane, giving lionfish their name.
- **6.** Yes. According to page 31, newts are a type of amphibian.

## TRUE OR FALSE? ANSWERS

- **1. True.** According to section "Porcupinefish" on page 9, we know that "A porcupinefish, sometimes called a *puffer fish* or *blowfish*, is a type of fish with pointy spines covering its body." So, the correct answer is True.
- **2. False.** According to section "Fire-bellied Toad" on page 15, we know that "Fire-bellied toads are named for their bright coloring. When a fire-bellied toad feels threatened, it shows its bright belly." So, the correct answer is False.
- **3. False.** According to section "Lionfish" on page 19, we know that "Lionfish have venomous spines." So, the correct answer is False.

- **4. True.** According to section "Zorilla" on page 23, we know that "The zorilla, also called the striped polecat, is like a skunk." So, the correct answer is True.
- **5. True.** According to section "Hornet" on page 27, we know that "Like bees, hornets sting their predators." So, the correct answer is True.
- **6. False.** According to section "Texas Horned Lizard" on page 29, we know that "The lizard can shoot its blood as far as 5 feet (1.5 meters) away!" So, the correct answer is False.
