## **ANSWERS**

- 1. b. Teeth. According to section "Alligator Snapping Turtle" on page 5, we know that "Snapping turtles don't have teeth." So, the correct answer is B.
- **2. c. Blood.** According to section "Vampire Bat" on page 11, we know that "The vampire bat drinks blood!" So, the correct answer is C.
- **3. a. Long, thin bodies.** According to section "Lamprey" on page 15, we know that "Lampreys are fish with long, thin bodies." So, the correct answer is A.
- **4. d. Dangerous venom.** According to section "Sea Krait" on page 17, we know that "Sea kraits have dangerous venom that kills their prey." So, the correct answer is D.
- **5.** According to page 7, the "common fangtooth is a fish that lives deep in the ocean."
- **6.** According to page 46, a tusk is "a long, curving tooth that sticks out of the side of the mouth and usually grows in pairs, as in the elephant and walrus."

## TRUE OR FALSE? ANSWERS

- **1. True.** According to section "Goose" on page 19, we know that "Geese have things in their mouths that look like teeth. They are called tomia." So, the correct answer is True.
