## ANSWERS

- 1. b. Gelatinous.** According to section "Blobfish" on page 5, we know that "The blobfish lives deep in the ocean. Its body is gelatinous." So, the correct answer is B.
- 2. c. No hair.** According to section "Naked mole-rat" on page 9, we know that "This little rodent has no hair to cover its pink skin." So, the correct answer is C.
- 3. a. Feelers.** According to section "Star-nosed mole" on page 15, we know that "The star-nosed mole's freaky feelers help it find prey as it digs through the ground." So, the correct answer is A.
- 4. d. Like red skulls.** According to section "Uakari" on page 22, we know that "Their faces look like red skulls." So, the correct answer is D.
- 5.** According to pages 10 and 11, Mexican hairless dogs and sphynx cats are both hairless animals.
- 6.** According to page 25, a stargazer is a fish.

## TRUE OR FALSE? ANSWERS

- 1. True.** According to section "Stargazer" on page 25, we know that "Stargazers are venomous (poisonous)." So, the correct answer is True.
- 2. True.** According to section "Wolfish" on page 28, we know that "Wolfish can grow more than 5 feet (1.5 meters) long and weigh more than 40 pounds (18 kilograms). That's as heavy as a 3-year-old child and as long as a refrigerator is tall!" So, the correct answer is True.
- 3. False.** According to section "Peacock flounder" on page 31, we know that "Both of their eyeballs are on the top side of their head!" So, the correct answer is False.
- 4. False.** According to section "Bobbit worm" on page 39, we know that "Bobbit worms are some of the largest worms." So, the correct answer is False.
- 5. True.** According to section "California condor" on page 41, we know that "California condors are endangered ... There are only about 400 left in the world." So, the correct answer is True.
- 6. False.** According to section "Naked mole-rat" on page 9, we know that "Naked mole-rats rarely get cancer and can go up to 18 minutes without oxygen!" So, the correct answer is False.
