ANSWERS

- 1. d. Mouths. According to section "Wobbegong" on page 4, we know that "Wobbegongs have huge mouths and sharp teeth." So, the correct answer is D.
- **2. d. Horses.** According to section "Tapir" on page 9, we know that "A tapir looks like a pig. But it's actually more closely related to horses and rhinoceroses." So, the correct answer is D.
- **3. c. Crabs.** According to section "Ostracod" on page 19, we know that "Ostracods are relatives of crabs and shrimp." So, the correct answer is C.

- 4. a. 5 feet tall. According to section "Okapi" on page 26, we know that "Okapis are only about 5 feet (1.5 meters) tall." So, the correct answer is A.
- **5.** According to page 5, a wobbegong is a shark.
- **6.** No. According to page 11, a sea butterfly is a type of snail.

TRUE OR FALSE? ANSWERS

- 1. True. According to section "Tree Kangaroo" on page 7, we know that "Marsupials are mammals whose babies are born very small and continue to grow in a special pouch on the mother's stomach." So, the correct answer is True.
- **2. True.** According to section "Saiga" on page 13, we know that "It uses its nose to keep out of its lungs the dust stirred up by the saiga as they move about in large herds." So, the correct answer is True.
