## ANSWERS

- 1. a. 1754.** According to the section “The Battle of Quebec-Source of Ghosts?” on page 16, we know that “The Battle of Quebec was part of the French and Indian War that started in 1754.” So, the correct answer is A.
- 2. b. Spiritualism.** According to the section “What Is a Ghost?” on page 13, we know that “Some people believe that a person called a *medium* can talk to the ghosts of dead people. This belief is called *spiritualism*.” So, the correct answer is B.
- 3. c. 32 acres of land.** According to the section “Ghosts on the Plains of Abraham” on page 26, we know that “Between 1635 and 1645, he was given 32 acres of land on a high area above the St. Lawrence River.” So, the correct answer is C.
- 4. a. Battle of Passchendaele.** According to the section “Other ‘Haunted’ Battlefields” on page 42, we know that “The third battle of Ypres is called the Battle of Passchendaele.” So, the correct answer is A.
- 5.** According to page 11, Jacob Marley is a ghost in Charles Dickens’s book *A Christmas Carol*.
- 6.** According to page 11, “The Legend of Sleepy Hollow” was written by American author Washington Irving.

## TRUE OR FALSE? ANSWERS

- 1. True.** According to the section “What Is a Ghost?” on page 7, we know that “But the ghosts seem to be shadows or are transparent—you can see through them.” So, the correct answer is True.
- 2. True.** According to the section “Ghosts on the Plains of Abraham” on page 28 and 29, we know that “Some people who have visited the National Battlefields Park say they have seen shadowy figures there” and “Do the ghosts of Wolfe and Montcalm come back to fight the battle again and again?” So, the correct answer is True.
- 3. True.** According to section “Other ‘Haunted’ Battlefields” on page 36, we know that “This war took more American lives than any other war in history.” So, the correct answer is True.
