ANSWERS

- 1. d. All of the above. According to the section "What Is a Cloud?" on page 14, we know that "Rain, snow and hail form in clouds." So, the correct answer is D.
- 2. a. The boundary between two huge masses of air that have different temperatures. According to the section "What Is a Cloud?" on page 18, we know that "A front is the boundary between two huge masses of air that have different temperatures." So, the correct answer is A.
- **3. c. Pacific Ocean.** According to the section "Other Foggy Places" on page 29, we know that "Fog often covers the western part of the city. It forms when warm air flows over the cold Pacific Ocean water." So, the correct answer is C.

- **4. b. Air pollution.** According to the section "Smoke + Fog = Smog" on page 44, we know that "For example, walking or riding bikes instead of driving helps reduce air pollution." So, the correct answer is B.
