#### ANSWERS

- **1.b. France.** According to page 7, we know that, after being kidnapped by soldiers, H.C. arrives in Paris, France. So, the correct answer is B.
- **2.d. Nightingale.** According to page 31, we know that the emperor "had heard that the sweetest and most beautiful voice in the land was that of the nightingale." So, the correct answer is D.
- **3.a. Victor Hugo.** According to section "Victor Hugo" on page 59, we know that "[Victor Hugo] thought so much about French commoners' misery that he wrote an entire book about it. It's called *Les Misérables*, or *The Miserable Ones*." So, the correct answer is A.
- **4. c. Quasimodo.** According to section "The Hunchback of Notre Dame and the Cathedral of Notre Dame" on page

62, we know that "The Hunchback of Notre Dame is another famous novel by Victor Hugo. The story takes place during the 1400's in Paris. It centers on Quasimodo, a deformed bell ringer, and his unrequited love for a dancer called Esmeralda." So, the correct answer is C.

- 5. According to section "Victor Hugo and Les Misérables" on page 61, we know that "Was it right for me to steal the bread when I thought I might starve? Should I have gone hungry and kept my honor?"
- 6. According to section "Who's Who" on pages 60 and 61, we know that the ghosts of Edith Piaf, Agatha Christie, Edgar Allan Poe, Victor Hugo, Danny Kaye, and Dr. Seuss join a grown-up H.C. in Paris.
