- 1. c. Penguin. According to section "What Is a Flightless Bird?" on page 6, we know that "A penguin is a flightless bird." So, the correct answer is C.
- **2. b. Feathers.** According to section "How Do Penguins Stay Warm And Dry?" on page 20, we know that "On top of their skin, penguins have thick coats of feathers." So, the correct answer is B.
- **3. a. Kiwi.** According to section "Just What Are Ratites?" on page 40, we know that "This group includes the ostrich, the emu, rheas, cassowaries, and kiwis." So, the correct answer is A.
- **4. d. Elephant Bird.** According to section "What Is the Biggest Bird That Ever Lived?" on page 56, we know that "The largest bird ever known was the elephant bird of Madagascar." So, the correct answer is D.

TRUE OR FALSE? ANSWERS

- **1. True.** According to section "Where in the World Do Flightless Birds Live?" on page 8, we know that "There are 17 species, or kinds, of penguins." So, the correct answer is True.
- **2. False.** According to section "What Do Penguins Eat?" on page 16, we know that "Since they do not have teeth, penguins use their beaks to grab and hold wriggling prey." So, the correct answer is False.
