## **ANSWERS**

- 1. a. ¼ to ¾ inch long. According to section "Why Are Some Stink Bugs Called Shield Bugs?" on page 14, we know that "Most stink bugs are ¼ to ¾ inch (6 to 19 millimeters long)." So, the correct answer is A.
- **2. c. Cabbage.** According to section "What Does a Harlequin Bug Look Like?" on page 28, we know that "Harlequin bugs often 'hang out' on the leaves of their favorite crop: cabbage." So, the correct answer is C.
- **3. d. Assassin bug.** According to section "How Do Assassin Bugs Kill?" on page 38, we know that "Like many other predatory true bugs, assassin bugs shoot poison into the bodies of their victims." So, the correct answer is D.

- **4. b. Fish.** According to section "Which True Bug Swims on Its Back?" on page 48, we know that "A backswimmer's predators include fish and birds." So, the correct answer is B.
- According to page 63, a predator is "A hunting animal."
- **6.** According to page 63, *prey* is "Any animal that is hunted for food by another animal."

## TRUE OR FALSE? ANSWERS

- **1. True.** According to section "What Is a True Bug?" on page 6, we know that "Like other insects, true bugs have six legs." So, the correct answer is True.
- **2. False.** According to section "What Do Stink Bugs Feed On?" on page 18, we know that "Most kinds of stink bugs suck the juices of plants. Some kinds suck the body fluids of insects." So, the correct answer is False.
