ANSWERS

- 1. c. Broad. According to section "Was There a Real Atlantis?" on page 6, we know that "He was generally known by the nickname Plato, which means 'broad,' because of his broad shoulders." So, the correct answer is C.
- **2. d. Sirrush.** According to section "What Was the Sirrush of Babylon?" on page 20, we know that "King Nebuchadnezzar had called the creature a sirrush, which was the Babylonian word for dragon!" So, the correct answer is D.
- **3. b. Hammers.** According to section "The Secret of the Great Stone Monuments" on page 35, we know that "The people who built monuments had only simply tools, such as stone hammers, shovels made from the shoulder bones of oxen, and pickaxes made from deer antlers." So, the correct answer is B.

- **4. d. Roanoke Island.** According to section "What Became of the 'Lost Colony?'" on page 50, we know that "In July 1587, they arrived at tiny Roanoke Island off the northeastern coast of what is now North Carolina." So, the correct answer is D.
- According to page 14, Neandertals are named after the Neander Valley in Germany, where some of their bones were first discovered.
- **6.** According to page 16, the Neandertal is on the right. The man on the left is Cro-Magnon.
