ANSWERS

- 1. a. Mary Celeste. According to section "The Mystery of the Mary Celeste" on page 6, we know that "The most famous of all such mystery ships is the Mary Celeste, built in 1861." So, the correct answer is A.
- 2. c. The dead body of a large sea animal. According to section "Are There Prehistoric Reptiles Still Living in the Sea?" on page 13, we know that "When the net was hauled up, the ship's crewmen saw that instead of a mass of wiggling, flopping fish, it contained the dead, rotting body of some enormous sea animal." So, the correct answer is C.
- **3. b. An ancient Norse legend.** According to section "The Real Kraken" on page 20, we know that "An ancient Norse legend from Scandinavia tells that down in the deepest, darkest, coldest ocean waters there dwell enormous octopuslike monsters called krakens." So, the correct answer is B.

- **4. a. Giant squids.** According to section "The Real Kraken" on page 23, we know that "But then, krakenlike creatures began to appear! In 1853, the body of a huge squid washed up onto a beach in Denmark." So, the correct answer is A.
- **5.** According to page 26, a *legend* is a "story coming down from the past, which many people have believed."
- **6.** According to page 9, the *Dei Gratia* was the ship that discovered the abandoned *Mary Celeste*.

- **1. True.** According to section "The Mystery of the Mary Celeste" on page 8, we know that "Aboard were Captain Benjamin Briggs, his wife, their 2-year-old daughter, and a crew of seven." So, the correct answer is True.
