ANSWERS

- 1. d. Bright flash of light.** According to section "What Are UFO's?" on page 6, we know that "Suddenly, a bright flash of light in the sky startled him." So, the correct answer is D.
- 2. d. Meteor.** According to section "What Are UFO's?" on page 13, we know that "A group of boys saw what they thought was a meteor fall from the sky and land on a nearby wooded hill." So, the correct answer is D.
